"STAYING THE COURSE" means to pursue a goal regardless of any obstacles or criticism. That is exactly what we have done at Actors and Others. Nothing fancy, nothing trendy, just plain old hard work helping pets and their guardians. And we are proud of it!

In 1971 when we started, spay/neuter was an unfamiliar notion just starting to make inroads. We became one of a small number of groups focusing on pet overpopulation. Fast forward, and here we are 48 years later still continuing our core work of helping low income pet guardians spay and neuter their pets. Our experience shows us that in low income areas a large percentage of pets are not sterilized with cost being the biggest obstacle.

Our secondary program providing assistance so that pet guardians may obtain crucial veterinary care has exploded. In addition to adopting shelter pets, it is equally important to ensure that those pets remain healthy and in the homes they share with their guardians. The stories we hear are heartbreaking and the challenges pet guardians face when their pet becomes sick or injured are sobering. Many must choose between paying their rent and/or buying food with taking their pet to the veterinarian.

So where do we go from here? Back to work, of course! Nothing fancy, nothing trendy, just plain old hard work helping pets and their guardians.

OUR WORK UP CLOSE

A DOG NAMED MINN

Anna and Jerry were on their way home on New Year's Eve in 2017 when they noticed a dog walking up the middle of the dark street. They pulled over and scooped her up. Back home, the small, approximately 10 year old Chihuahua mix (whom they named Minn), slept for 2 days. When she awoke, she ate and drank ravenously, and Anna and Jerry learned she was blind.



Minn also had a large growth on her belly which the vet determined was a mammary tumor that needed surgery. Such tumors occur frequently in unspayed female dogs. This was an unexpected expense for Anna and Jerry, and they didn't know how they would help the dog that now had won their hearts. A friend told them about us, and we provided the assistance needed.

Unfortunately the tumor was malignant, and the vet gave Minn little time. But she lived a healthy, tranquil 8 months. "You came through for us and your donation extended her qualify of life," wrote Anna. "You keep hope alive at a time when it is so needed. The work that you do is life-changing and wonderful." Who knows what Minn went through for the first 10 years of her life, but Anna and Jerry gave her a loving and safe home when it was most needed. SOME HELPFUL TIPS TO KEEP YOUR PET HEALTHY



COLD SEASON – Dogs can pass a cold to other dogs, but you can't catch a cold from your dog, and your dog can't catch a cold from you. Cats too can get colds, but if it lasts longer than 5 to 7 days, then a trip to the veterinarian is warranted. Make sure they eat, drink and rest. Wipe the eyes with a warm, damp cloth. DON'T give over-the-counter human cold medications as they can be extremely dangerous. And NEVER let your dog stay out in inclement weather.

EAR INFECTIONS – Most dogs will suffer from this painful condition sometime during their life. Symptoms to look for are shaking the head, scratching and rubbing the ears. For adults most infections are caused by bacteria and yeast, but puppies usually have ear mites. Left untreated, infections can be damaging to hearing. It is best to visit your veterinarian to receive proper treatment.

ALTITUDE SICKNESS -At elevations above 8,000 feet dogs can get altitude sickness just like humans. So if you plan on taking your dog to such heights, take precautions since it can be hazardous and even cause pulmonary edema. Slowing ascent when you are hiking and slowing descent can be helpful as is not doing any strenuous exercise.

XYLITOL – While peanut butter is a common treat or to get dogs to take pills, be very careful when choosing the brand you use. The sweetener Xylitol, a low-calorie alternative to sugar, which is used in many foods is safe for humans but extremely toxic to dogs. Be sure to read the ingredients carefully when buying any food either for humans or pets. Peanut butter brands that contain Xylitol include Go Nuts, Co., Krush Nutrition, Nuts 'N More, P28 Foods and No Cow. PET STORES – In January, a new law in California mandates that only dogs, cats or rabbits that are obtained from an animal shelter or rescue may be sold in pet stores. If you choose this route to obtain your pet, just be careful. There are no longer any consumer protections and many unscrupulous breeders are starting their own non-profits to skirt the law.
